

**ABOUT THE PROGRAM**

Lakeshore College's Truck Driving Program prepares students for high-demand careers in the transportation industry through hands-on, real-world training. This semester-long program can be completed in as little as eight weeks, offering an accelerated pathway to earning a CDL Class A license. Students gain comprehensive instruction in vehicle operation, safety regulations, inspection procedures, and over-the-road driving skills. Training takes place both in the classroom and behind the wheel, ensuring graduates are confident and job-ready. Students also complete their CDL Class A road test on-site, providing a streamlined path from enrollment to licensure and employment.

**COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE THEORY**...provides the theory portion of Entry-Level Driver Training (ELDT) required by the Department of Labor for new CDL drivers. Students learn essential skills for safe commercial driving, including vehicle inspections, basic control, shifting and backing, coupling, hazard recognition, speed and space management, extreme condition driving, skid prevention, cargo handling, compliance, and trip planning. **CONDITION:** 30458 Truck Driving Program requirements met.
