

About the Grant & Great Lakes

LTC is one of 16 two-year institutions across Arkansas, Iowa, Minnesota, North Dakota, Ohio, and Wisconsin that received a combined \$2.1 million from Great Lakes to create over 1,000 paid internships for low-income students. LTC will collaborate with businesses and nonprofit organizations to provide the greatest number of current and future students with an educational opportunity they might not otherwise have.

Knowing that education has the power to change lives for the better, Great Lakes Higher Education Corporation & Affiliates was established as a nonprofit group focused on a single objective: helping students nationwide prepare for and succeed in postsecondary education and student loan repayment. As a leading student loan guarantor and servicer, Great Lakes has been selected by the U.S. Department of Education to provide assistance and repayment planning to more than 8 million borrowers—as well as assistance to colleges and lenders nationwide. The group's earnings support one of the largest and most respected education philanthropy programs in the country. Thanks to the Great Lakes Higher Education Corporation & Affiliates Two-Year Career Ready Internship Grant, LTC students have more opportunities to complete **PAID INTERNSHIPS** and gain real-world experience. Studies show that students who complete paid internships have a **HIGHER SUCCESS** rate of transitioning to full-time employment. The Grant provides intern wages and travel reimbursements for eligible students.

Student Eligibility Requirements

- Enrolled in Auto Collision, Advanced Manufacturing or Business and Technology programs
- Demonstrate financial need
- Have a minimum of 2.0 GPA
- Receive approval from program instructor to participate in the internship

Grant funding is not available for:

- Internships at Lakeshore Technical College
- Teaching internships, or internship involving work on political campaigns or religious ministry
- Apprenticeships
- Full-time internships
- Health care practicums
- High school dual enrollment
- Retroactive payment for internships completed in the past

Steps to Participate

1. Obtain approval from program instructor to complete an internship
2. Meet with the Career Placement Center to determine eligibility and review available internship opportunities
3. Complete resume review and mock interview with Career Placement Center
4. Submit resume and complete interview with employer
5. Await employer decision to begin internship

Students are encouraged to apply as soon as an internship opportunity becomes available. Internships are completed within the timeframe of each semester. It is recommended for students to begin applying for internships 6-8 weeks before the start of each semester. Employers make the hiring decision. Paid internships through Great Lakes Career Ready Grant are offered on a rolling basis, first-come, first-served basis.
